Purpose of job

- To promote and ensure quality teaching and effective learning of English.
- To support the wider aims of British Council and its cultural relations mission.

Context and environment

The British Council in Slovakia is focused on English and primarily on Teaching and Examinations services. The teaching centre operates out of city centre premises and through schools. There is currently a Senior Teacher, 3 full-time teachers under contract and 8-10 freelance teachers. The operation is approximately 5,000 class hours and 1,000 students. Currently about 54% of income comes from adult public courses, Young Learner courses contribute about 41% and the corporate business around 5%. The number of young learners is growing steadily and the strategy is for long-term growth of YL numbers. Contract teachers may also need to act as the senior responsible person in the teaching centre on occasions, although emergency contract procedures are in place to deal with serious situations.
